Quilt Day

Two yards of woven fabric – Suggestions –

One yard flannel or blanket fabric
Two ½ yards of fabrics fun and/or pretty together

Yard of batting

Polyester lightweight is less expensive - great for beginners
Cotton batting is also great for beginners
Wool batting is labor intense – can warp in laundry – difficult



Thread for Sewing and Basting

Quilting thread is heavy duty - but any cotton or polyester thread will do



Thread for Tying

Cotton embroidery floss
Yarn (heavy weight)

Needles for hand work

Chenille needles -larger eyed (size 13-16 will do)



***Pin cushion & pins**

Box with LARGE straight pins or safety pins - Put your name on pin cushions & boxes of pins

*Intend to use basting to reduce the need for pinning – easier also on sewing machine needles

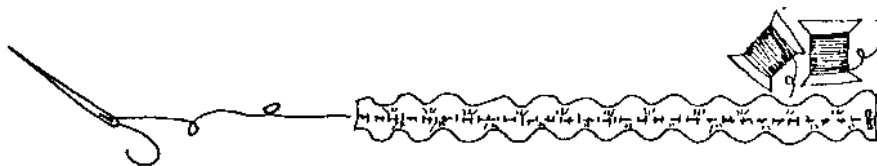
Sewing machine & needles

Bobbins threaded full
